Instruction AR 6142.5

ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION

The District's environmental education curriculum shall satisfy the following criteria:

- 1. Instruction shall be aligned to California's academic content standards.
- 2. The curriculum will be based on the Environmental Principles and Concepts described in the Model Curriculum Plan, required by AB1548, The Education and the Environment Initiative.
 - Principle I: The continuation and health of individual human lives and of human communities and societies depend on the health of the natural systems that provide essential goods and ecosystem services.
 - Principle II: The long-term functioning and health of terrestrial, freshwater, coastal and marine ecosystems are influenced by their relationships with human societies.
 - Principle III: Natural systems proceed through cycles that humans depend upon, benefit from and can alter.
 - Principle IV: The exchange of matter between natural systems and human societies affects the long-term functioning of both.
 - Principle V: Decisions affecting resources and natural systems are based on a wide range of considerations and decision-making processes.
- 3. Environmental education will be woven into the core curricular areas as appropriate.
- 4. The curriculum will foster environmental ethics.

The superintendent or designee will provide staff development as necessary to ensure that teachers are adequately prepared to teach the environmental principles and concepts.
