7.1 <u>Public Hearing – Instructional Materials Realignment Funding Program Transfer of Funds</u>

The State Legislature enacted Budget trailer bill SBX3 4 which, in part, provides local school districts with increased fiscal flexibility during the current State fiscal crisis. This legislation gives local school agencies the authority to use funds that are received from the State for certain programs, including the Instructional Materials Realignment Funding Program (IMRFP), for "any educational purpose, to the extent permitted by federal law." The flexibility to transfer funds from authorized programs is allowed for five years – from the current year through 2012-13. In order to exercise this transfer authority, SBX3 4 requires a school agency to hold a public hearing on the matter.

For the 2008-09 fiscal year, CCUSD has \$378,000 of IMRFP funds available in Resource Code 71560 which can be transferred in full to the General Fund Resource Code 00000. This money will be utilized to offset the approximately \$325,000 of mid-year cuts to our categorical programs that have been imposed by the State. The remainder of the \$378,000 will be utilized in the General Fund as part of the District's expenditure reduction plan for 2009-10.

10.1 Presentation of the Second Interim Report for 2008-2009

In addition to other fiscal requirements, AB 1200 and AB 2756 legislation was enacted to insure full public disclosure of a public school district's financial position in the current and future years. The purpose of the interim reports, as required under AB 1200 and AB 2756, is to establish a procedure for the Board of Education, the public and other interested agencies to receive information regarding the financial condition of an entity during periodic intervals of the fiscal year.

RESOLUTION #23-2008/2009 TO ORDER BIENNIAL GOVERNING BOARD ELECTION

Order of Election of Culver City Unified School District of Los Angeles County, California.

RESOLUTION ORDERING GOVERNING BOARD MEMBER ELECTION

RESOLVED that pursuant to Education Code (EC) §5000-5030, the Los Angeles County Superintendent of Schools (County Superintendent) is hereby ORDERED to call an election for the purpose, and in accordance with the designations contained in the following specifications of the Election Order made under the authority of EC §5302, §5304, and §5322.

SPECIFICATIONS OF THE ELECTION ORDER

The election shall be held on Tuesday, November 3, 2009. The polling hours shall be from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

The purpose of the election is to submit to the voters of the district the question of whether <u>3</u> members shall be elected to the Governing Board of the <u>Culver City Unified School District.</u>

The Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk (Registrar-Recorder) will perform all the duties incident to the preparation for and holding of the above-mentioned election. The Culver City Unified School District shall pay the costs of the election. If any agency holds an election on November 3, 2009, the Culver City Unified School District shall pay its pro rata share pertaining to the conduct of this election and shall be under the provisions of the appropriate sections of the Education and Election Codes.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of the district is hereby directed to furnish two copies of this order to the County Superintendent not less than 57 days prior to the date set for the election.

The foregoing Resolution and Order was adopted and affirmed by the Governing Board of <u>Culver City Unified School</u> District of Los Angeles County, being the Board authorized by law to make the designations contained herein, by formal vote as follows:

11.2a Certification of the Second Interim Report for 2008-2009

In addition to other fiscal requirements, AB 1200 and AB 2756 legislation was enacted to ensure full public disclosure of a public school district's financial position in the current and future years. The purpose of the interim reports, as required under AB 1200 and AB 2756, is to establish a procedure for the Board of Education, the public and other interested agencies to receive information regarding the financial condition of a school district during periodic intervals of the fiscal year.

Based upon a review of the interim report, the Board of Education certifies the district in one of the following three categories:

- (1) POSITIVE, if the district will be able to meet its financial obligations for the current fiscal year and subsequent two fiscal years,
- (2) QUALIFIED, if the district may not meet its financial obligations for the current fiscal year and subsequent two fiscal years,
- (3) NEGATIVE, if the district will be unable to meet its financial obligations for the remainder of the current fiscal year and subsequent two fiscal years.

Administration has been refining the budget since the First Interim Report and is now submitting the Second Interim Report for a Positive Certification based upon budget modifications, reductions and revenue changes made since that time. Major modifications resulted from the significant funding losses imposed on CCUSD by the recently enacted 17-month 2009-10 State Budget which included mid-year cuts in 2008-09.

In certifying the 2008-09 Second Interim Report, the Board understands its fiduciary responsibility to maintain fiscal solvency for the current and subsequent two fiscal years. The Board recognizes that this Second Interim Report represents revenue and expenditure projections over the multi-year period which are based on the best known information at this time. Further, the Board is well aware of the State fiscal crisis and realizes the State may again reduce the funding it provides to the District when Governor Schwarzenegger presents his Revised 2009-10 State Budget in early June after the outcome of the May 19 Special Election is taken into consideration.

In order to maintain fiscal solvency and achieve Positive Certification, the projections in this Second Interim Report utilize the District's existing one-time supplemental reserves as well as the budget cuts that were adopted by the Board on March 10, 2009.
