Board Vice President Mrs. Davis called the meeting of the Culver City Unified School District Board of Education to order at 6:00 p.m. The Board adjourned to Closed Session at 6:01 p.m. and reconvened the public meeting at 7:00 p.m. with four Board members in attendance. Dr. Beagles-Roos was absent. Mr. George Laase led the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### **Report from Closed Session**

Mrs. Davis reported that the Governing Board met in Closed Session regarding issues listed on today's Closed Session agenda and announced that no reportable actions were taken.

#### 7. Adoption of Agenda

It was moved by Mr. Zeidman and seconded by Dr. Russell that the Board adopt the agenda of June 29, 2009 as presented. The motion was approved with a vote of 4 - Ayes and 0 - Nays.

Mrs. Davis opened the Public Hearing for the Culver City Unified School District Initial Collective Bargaining Proposal to the Culver City Federation of Teachers (CCFT) for the 2009-2010 School Year at 7:04 p.m. There being no comments from audience members, Mrs. Davis closed the Public Hearing at 7:04 p.m.

#### 9. Information Items

#### 9.1 2009-2010 Budget Presentation

Mr. El Fattal presented the actions that have been taken over the past seventeen months to balance the budget. He also presented information from the 2009-2010 State Budget. Mr. El Fattal concluded that the sooner the District makes the additional cuts, the more savings will be generated. He also stated that there is a possibility of early cuts, mid-year cuts and late-year cuts. Mr. El Fattal responded to questions from audience members. Mr.

Gourley inquired if anyone researched his idea of salary cuts using a sliding scale. All Board members present agreed that they would be interested in those numbers.

  It was moved by Dr. Russell and seconded by Mr. Gourley that the Board adopt the Culver City Unified School

  District's Initial Collective Bargaining Proposal to the Association of Classified Employees (ACE) for the 20092010 School Year as presented. The motion was approved with a vote of 4 Ayes and 0 Nays.
- 10.2b Approval is Recommended for the Adoption of Culver City Unified School District Initial Bargaining Proposal for the Culver City Federation of Teachers (CCFT) for the 2009-2010 School Year David Mielke commented on the proposal and provided feedback from the teachers. He stated that the proposal comes early when there is a discussion about a reduction in salaries for teachers; and asked how the District's employees rate against other district's salaries. He advised that the District's salaries are quite low according to the County. He stated that cuts in salary need to take place with the administrators in the District Office first, and Board members' Health and Welfare benefits need to be cut. He also felt that the Board needed to look at what consultants the District continues to pay; and cutting mileage for administrators. Mr. Gourley thanked Mr. Mielke for his comments. He addressed Mr. Mielke's comments on Board members' health benefits, and reviewed the reductions that some Board members have taken on their health benefits. Mr. Gourley calculated that there has been about a forty percent reduction in Board members' health benefits. Mr. Gourley applauded Mr. Mielke on how he seemingly has convinced some community members that if the Board did not take their health benefits, a parcel tax would not be needed. Mr. Gourley asked to see the cumulative effects on the budget with a one percent increase in salary for management that Mr. Mielke referenced, and the effect with a one percent decrease. Mr. Zeidman and Mrs. Davis agreed. Mrs. Davis commented that it is important to address salaries across the board. It was moved by Mr. Zeidman and seconded by Dr. Russell that the Board adopt the Culver City Unified School District Initial Bargaining Proposal for the Culver City Federation of Teachers for (CCFT) for the 2009-2010 School Year as presented. The motion was approved with a vote of 4 - Ayes and 0 - Nays.

#### Adjournment .

There being no further business, it was moved by Mr. Zeidman, seconded by Dr. Russell and approved with a vote of 4 – Ayes and 0 – Nays to adjourn the meeting. Board Vice President Mrs. Davis adjourned the meeting at 7:35 p.m.

Board President Dr. Beagles-Roos called the meeting of the Culver City Unified School District Board of Education to order at 6:00 p.m. The Board adjourned to Closed Session at 6:01 p.m. and reconvened the public meeting at 7:00 p.m. with all Board members in attendance. Mr. Kevin Kronfeld led the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### Report from Closed Session

Dr. Beagles-Roos reported that the Governing Board met in Closed Session regarding issues listed on today's Closed Session agenda and announced that no reportable actions were taken.

#### 7. Public Hearing

## 7.1 Specific Waiver Request - Instructional Materials Funding Realignment Program

Dr. Beagles-Roos opened the Public Hearing at 7:05 p.m. Dr. Coté explained the specifics of the Waiver such as why the Waiver was being requested and submitted. There being no comments from the public, it was moved by Mr. Gourley and seconded by Mr. Zeidman to close the Public Hearing. The Public Hearing was closed and Regular Session was resumed at 7:06 p.m.

#### 8. Adoption of Agenda

It was moved by Mr. Zeidman and seconded by Mrs. Davis to adopt the July 28, 2009 agenda as presented. The motion was unanimously approved.

Dr. Beagles-Roos called the Consent Agenda and asked if any member of the audience or the Board wished to withdraw any item. Karlo Silbiger requested that item 9.1 be withdrawn. Janet Chabola requested that items 9.4 and 9.5 be withdrawn. George Laase and Mr. Zeidman requested that item 9.2 be withdrawn. It was moved by Mr. Zeidman and seconded by Dr. Russell to approve Consent Agenda Items 9.3, and 9.6–9.8 as presented. The motion was unanimously approved.

# 9.1 Approval is Recommended for the Minutes of Regular Meeting – June 23, 2009

Mr. Silbiger withdrew this item to request a review of the Minutes, and for item 14.1b to reflect that Mr. Zeidman stated that Mr. Gourley's suggestion of taking a tier approach to salary cuts is still possible. It was moved by Mr. Gourley and seconded by Mr. Zeidman to approve the Minutes as suggested. The motion was approved with a vote of 4 - Ayes, 1 - Nay, and 1 - Abstention from Dr. Beagles-Roos since she was not present at this meeting.

## 9.2 Approval is Recommended for Purchase Orders and Warrants

Mr. Laase withdrew this item to suggest that the starting date on the Purchase Requisitions indicate July 1<sup>st</sup> instead of June 27<sup>th</sup>. Mr. El Fattal explained that the dates are a system that is used throughout the County and not the District. Dr. Beagles-Roos inquired about a purchase order for Xerox. Mr. El Fattal explained that it was for the annual contract. Mr. Zeidman inquired if some of the purchase orders were open. Mr. El Fattal confirmed that some of the purchase orders were open. It was moved by Mr. Gourley and seconded by Dr. Russell that the Board approve purchase orders from June 27, 2009 through July 17, 2009; and warrants for June 12, 2009 through July 16, 2009 as presented. The motion was unanimously approved.

Janet Chabola inquired as to what impact the rehired personnel are having on the budget. Mr. El Fattal responded that most of the rehires are included in the adopted budget, and he discussed the impact on the budget. It was moved by Dr. Russell and seconded by Mr. Gourley that the Board approve Certificated Personnel Reports No. 2 and Classified Personnel Reports No. 2 as presented. The motion was unanimously approved.

#### 11. Public Recognition

#### 11.1 Superintendent's Report

Dr. Coté, with the hopeful approval of the Board, introduced Kevin Kronfeld as the new principal of Culver City Adult School. Dr. Coté read a brief bio of Mr. Kronfeld's accomplishments. Mr. Kronfeld thanked the Board for the opportunity to work in the district. Dr. Coté reported on 2008-2009 school year issues that were being finalized; the addition of more students and trying to level out class size; the Governor's conference call that she listened in on; and her meeting with the President of West Los Angeles College and members from City Hall. She also congratulated staff members Leslie Lockhart and Asuncion Romo on their new babies.

#### 11.2 Assistant Superintendents' Reports

Ms. Laura reported that she attended the Rock and Mineral Club event where she accepted a donation on behalf of the District. Ms. Laura reported that there will be a staff development in August in partnership with the Music Center. It will be a five day institute to learn about integrating the arts in the curriculum.

Mr. El Fattal reported on the State Budget and stated that he does not have numbers yet but he will bring the information to a future meeting.

#### 11.3 Members of the Audience

Members of the audience spoke about:

• Jerry Chabola inquired about the 2009-2010 school calendar and if the students' attendance would be tracked due to the changes made in the calendar year, such as starting school before Labor Day. He also inquired as to why there are two weeks off and then fifteen academic days back in school before testing starts at the secondary level. Mr. Chabola commented on the overgrown grass at Linwood Howe Elementary and Helms Field. He asked when the rental fees would be increased for using the fields.

#### 11.4 Members of the Board of Education

Board Members spoke about:

- Mrs. Davis requested to adjourn the meeting in memory of two LAUSD teachers Howard Manson and Marvin McMahon. She stated how she is looking forward to proceeding with the parcel tax measure.
   Mrs. Davis also commended the District on how staff has handled the budget crisis, and commented that the future of the school system is scary.
- Mr. Zeidman reported that he met with Senator Price and Senator O'Neil and he discussed the concerns of
  the District. He informed audience members the Board was going to vote on Wednesday to proceed with
  the parcel tax and asked for everyone's help with getting it passed. Mr. Zeidman stated that he was happy
  to see that three of the candidates for the Board were present. He commented that Helms Field was

looking really bad and inquired if deferred maintenance funds could be used to put concrete down so people are not walking through dirt and mud to get to the field. He would also like to hear what has been done with the Anti-Bullying Committee.

- Dr. Russell stated that he was happy with the district website, and that it was nice to hear about the arts programs. He agrees with Mr. Chabola on tracking information on how the calendar changes are affecting student attendance. Dr. Russell commented on correspondence received from the County stating that the district's budget might not be approved, and stated that cuts should be made sooner rather than later.
- Mr. Gourley inquired if information that was made available during Closed Session could be made public in regards to his suggestion of a tier approach to budget cuts. Dr. Coté replied that it was a negotiable item so it could not be made public at this time. Mr. Gourley stated the bottom line was that it would not be enough.
- Dr. Beagles-Roos commented that she thought the parcel tax mailer was done very well. She stated she wanted to clarify a response that she made the previous night in regards to the ballot for the parcel tax measure and what would it fund. She also addressed a question that was raised about teacher quality or effectiveness. Dr. Russell interrupted and stated he was not questioning teacher quality or effectiveness, he was talking about whether or not the District could use standardized test scores to evaluate teachers. Dr. Beagles-Roos stated that the topic of teacher evaluations could be agendized. Mr. Gourley and Dr. Russell agreed to agendize the item.

Mr. El Fattal presented the report to Board members.

#### 12.2 "Going Green" Program Update

Mr. El Fattal and Mike Korgan, Director of Maintenance, Operations, and Transportation, presented information on their joint efforts in assisting the District in going "green." Jerry Chabola commented that whoever oversaw the refurbishing of the bathrooms neglected to place urinals in the boy's bathroom. ## 7.1 Williams Textbook Sufficiency

The Board of Education will receive public input regarding Williams Textbook Sufficiency.

The Williams Legislation for Instructional Materials can be found in SB 550 (Chapter 900/Statutes 2004) and Education Code section 60119.

All districts are required to hold a public hearing on textbook sufficiency. As part of the hearing, the governing board shall determine whether each pupil has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials in the following areas:

- Reading/language arts, mathematics, science, and history/social science
- Foreign language and health courses
- Science laboratory equipment for science lab courses for grades 9-12, as appropriate

Districts are required to hold the public hearing to determine instructional materials sufficiency for students in all schools. The hearing is to be held on or before the eighth week of school.

"Sufficient" textbooks or instructional materials, or both, means that each pupil, including English Learners, has a textbook or instructional materials, or both, to use in class and take home.



# 14.2b Approval of Resolution #12 Regarding Sufficiency of Instructional Materials

THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED that for the 2009-2010 school year, the School District has provided each pupil with sufficient textbooks and instructional materials consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks.

# SUPPLEMENTAL EDUCATIONAL SERVICES MASTER CONTRACT

THIS MASTER CONTRACT ("Contract") is made and entered into on \_\_\_\_\_\_\_, between the Culver City Unified School District (hereinafter referred to as "LEA" [local educational agency] or "District"), a public school district duly operating under the laws of the state of California, and \_\_\_\_\_\_\_, a Supplemental Service Provider (hereinafter referred to as "PROVIDER") for the purpose of providing supplemental services to eligible LEA students. "Eligible students" are those students identified by the District who meet specific requirements under Title I.

WHEREAS, the LEA is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required:

WHEREAS, the LEA is in need of such special services and advice;

WHEREAS, PROVIDER is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the LEA, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

WHEREAS, the No Child Left Behind Act, 20 U.S.C. Section 6316(e) outlines the requirements for supplemental educational services;

WHEREAS, Section 6316(e) (3) of the No Child Left Behind Act mandates that a school district's contract with a provider must include the following:

- a. Requires the LEA to develop, in consultation with parents (and the provider chosen by parents), a statement of specific achievement goals for the student, how the student's progress will be measured, and a timetable for improving achievement, in the case of a student with disabilities, is consistent with the student's Individualized Education Program;
- Describes how the student's parents and teacher or teachers will be regularly informed of the student's progress;
- c. Provides for the termination of the agreement if the provider is unable to meet the goals and timetables required;
- d. Contains provision with respect to making payment to the provider by the LEA;
- e. Prohibits the provider from disclosing to the public the identify of any student eligible for, or receiving, supplemental services without the written permission of the parents of such student;

WHEREAS, PROVIDER has been approved by the California State Department of Education and has met the qualifications to be certified as a supplemental service provider; and

WHEREAS, PROVIDER is willing to provide such services to LEA's eligible students if selected by the parents/guardians of eligible students.

**THEREFORE**, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL PROMISES CONTAINED HEREIN, it is agreed between the parties as follows:

#### 1. Individual Supplemental Services Agreements

An Individual Supplemental Services Agreement (ISSA) shall be developed by LEA in consultation with parents/guardians and PROVIDER for each LEA eligible student whose parent/guardian elects to receive supplemental services from PROVIDER.

a. The ISSA shall include at least the following terms:

- (1) A statement of specific achievement goals for the student, how the student's progress will be measured, and a timetable for improving achievement that, in the case of a student with disabilities, is consistent with the student's individualized education program under section 614(d) of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (20 USC § 1414 (d).
- (2) That PROVIDER shall keep the parents and teachers informed of the student's progress by providing regular written reports.
- (3) That the LEA may, without limitation, terminate the ISSA in the event the goals and/or timetables referenced hereinabove (Paragraph 1.a.1) are not satisfied.
- (4) That Parents/guardians shall not be charged for any services rendered under the ISSA. Provided, however, that the parents/guardians and PROVIDER are not barred from entering into a separate contract, without involvement of the LEA, for provision of additional paid services, where permitted by law.
- (5) That the PROVIDER shall not disclose to any member of the public the identity of any student eligible for, or receiving, supplemental educational services under this subsection without the written permission of the parents of such student.
- b. Changes in any student's ISSA may only be made with the written consent of the LEA in consultation with parents/guardians. PROVIDER, LEA, or the parents/guardians may request a review of a student's ISSA.

#### 2. Parents/Guardianship

For the purpose of the Contract, a parent is the natural or adoptive parent, legal guardian, or a surrogate parent appointed by LEA.

#### 3. Student Records

The term "student record" is defined as any of Provider's records pertaining to the student which, if prepared, owned, or retained by the LEA, would constitute an "education record" under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA) (20 U.S.C. § 1232g) or a "pupil record" under the California Pupil Records Act (Education Code §§ 49060-49078). PROVIDER will maintain an access log delineating date, time, agency, and identity of any individual accessing student records who is not in the direct employ of the PROVIDER. PROVIDER agrees to provide access to and copies of student records to LEA and/or the parents/guardians. PROVIDER shall not allow access to any student record without the written consent of the parent/guardian or LEA, except as required by law. Upon completion or termination of the ISSA or termination of this Contract, PROVIDER shall turn over to LEA all student records for LEA's eligible students to whom PROVIDER has provided services under this Contract.

#### 4. Nondisclosure

The PROVIDER shall not disclose to the public the identity of any student eligible for, or receiving, Supplemental Services without the written permission of the parents/guardians of such student

# 5. Access by LEA

PROVIDER shall notify LEA of the location and/or any change in location at which it is providing services to LEA's eligible students. It shall allow access to its facilities for periodic monitoring of each student's instructional program by LEA and shall be invited to participate in the review of each student's progress by LEA. LEA representatives shall have access to observe each student at work, observe the instructional setting, interview PROVIDER, and review each student's progress including the behavior intervention plan, if any.

#### 6. Fingerprints

In accordance with Education Code § 45125.1, PROVIDER shall conduct a criminal background check of its employees and/or subcontractors and, upon receipt of those checks, certify to the LEA that no employee and/or subcontractors of PROVIDER working with students of the school district has been convicted of a violent or serious felony as defined by statues. The provider will submit to the LEA a copy of the clearance notification received per employee. PROVIDER shall supply LEA with a list of names of those employees and/or subcontractors who are cleared to work with students of the LEA a fingerprint certification form will be submitted with monthly invoices and attendance registers.

# 7. Independent Contractor Status

This agreement is by and between two independent agents and is not intended to and shall not be construed to create the relationship of agent, servant, employee, partnership, joint venture, or association. PROVIDER understands and agrees that it shall be responsible for providing its own salaries, payroll taxes, withholding, insurance, workers compensation coverage and all other benefits of any kind, as required by law for its own employees, and assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this agreement.

# 8. Conflict of Interest:

This Agreement is subject to Board Policy 9270(a) governing conflicts of interest. PROVIDER agrees to furnish to LEA (upon request) a valid copy of the most recently adopted partnership agreements or bylaws of the corporation and also a complete and accurate list of the Governing Board of Directors (or Trustees or Partners) and to timely update said information as changes in such governance occur. PROVIDER shall avoid any actual or potential conflict of interest on behalf of itself or its employees providing services hereunder, including, but not limited, to employment with LEA, including its charter schools.

#### 9. Accident/Incident Report

PROVIDER agrees to submit a written accident report to LEA within 24 hours of an accident or incident when a pupil has suffered an injury, injured another individual, or has been involved in an activity requiring notification of law enforcement or emergency personnel.

#### 10. Discrimination

PROVIDER shall not discriminate on the basis of race, religion, sex, national origin, age, handicap, or sexual orientation in employment or operation of its programs.

# 11. Child Abuse Reporting

PROVIDER assures LEA that all staff members, including volunteers, are familiar with and agree to adhere to child abuse and/or missing children reporting obligations and procedures under California law, including but not limited to, California Education Code § 49370 and California Penal Code §§ 11166 et seq. PROVIDER agrees to provide annual training to all its employees regarding mandated reporting of child abuse and missing children. PROVIDER agrees that all staff members will abide by such laws in a timely manner. PROVIDER shall, in addition to any other obligation imposed by law, submit immediately by facsimile and mail, within twenty-four (24) hours an accident or incident report to LEA when it becomes aware of circumstances including, but not limited to: allegations of molestation, child abuse, missing children under PROVIDER's supervision.

# 12. Supplies, Equipment and Facilities

PROVIDER shall be solely responsible for the provision of all appropriate supplies, equipment, and facilities for a pupil as required in his/her ISSA.

#### 13. Inspection and Audit

PROVIDER shall provide access to records or reports, or other matter relating to the Contract, upon request by LEA. Fiscal records shall be maintained by PROVIDER for five (5) years and shall be available for audit.

#### 14. Indemnification

PROVIDER shall defend, hold harmless, and indemnify LEA and its governing board, officers, agents, and employees from and against all liabilities and claims for damage for deaths, sickness, or injury to any person(s) or damage to any property, including, without limitation, all consequential damages and expenses (including attorney fees), from any cause whatsoever arising from or connected with its service hereunder, resulting form the negligence or intentional acts of PROVIDER, its agents, or employees. It is understood and agreed that such indemnity shall survive the termination of this agreement.

LEA shall defend, hold harmless and indemnify PROVIDER and its governing board, offices, agents, and employees from all liabilities and claims for damage for death, sickness, or injury to any person(s) or damage to any property, including, without limitation, all consequential damages and expenses (including attorney fees), from any cause whatsoever resulting from the negligence or intentional acts of LEA, its agents, or employees. It is understood that such indemnity shall survive the termination of this contract. The District shall not be liable for acts of the students or the student's parent/guardian, family member, etc.

#### 15. Insurance

During the entire term of this agreement and any extension or modification thereof, PROVIDER shall keep in effect a policy or policies of general liability insurance, of at least one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for

each person and one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence for all damages arising out of death, bodily injury, sickness or disease from any one accident or occurrence, and one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence for all damages and liability arising out of injury to or destruction of property for each accident or occurrence. Not later than the effective date of this agreement, PROVIDER shall provide LEA with satisfactory evidence of insurance, naming LEA as additional certificate holder, including a provision for a twenty (20) calendar day written notice to LEA before cancellation or material change, evidencing the above specific coverage. The PROVIDER will supply to the LEA with an endorsement page listing the LEA on said endorsement page. The PROVIDER shall, at its own cost and expense, procure and maintain insurance under the Worker's Compensation Law of California, if applicable. LEA reserves the right to revise the requirements of this provision at any time. If LEA determines that additional insurance coverage is necessary, LEA will reopen negotiations with PROVIDER to modify the terms of this agreement.

#### 16. Payment

The LEA shall make payment to the PROVIDER for services required under an ISSA. Such services shall be billed on an hourly-rate basis, at the rate specified in the ISSA, provided that the maximum hourly rate specified in the ISSA shall not exceed \$50.00. Provided, further, that in no event shall the LEA incur any obligation or expense to PROVIDER, or be responsible for making any payment to PROVIDER in excess of the applicable State and/or Federal reimbursement limits (currently \$849.06 per student for the 2009-2010 school year).

#### 17. Monthly Invoices

PROVIDER shall submit to LEA monthly invoices itemized by name/address of students, service provided and actual number of hours for which services were provided, and amount owed. Invoices shall be submitted to LEA by the close of fiscal year, June 30, 2010. LEA shall process payments to PROVIDER within forty-five (45) days of submission of such invoices, except in those situations identified in Paragraph 19, below.

#### 18. Records of Attendance

PROVIDER shall maintain daily records of student services provided, including the name/address of student, the name of PROVIDER's employee who rendered the service, and the amount of time of such service. PROVIDER shall provide a copy of such records to LEA monthly, including parent signatures validating services rendered.

# 19. Right to Withhold

LEA may withhold payment to PROVIDER, on ten (10) working days written notice of such withholding, when in the opinion of the LEA:

- a. PROVIDER's performance, in whole or in part, either has not been carried out or is insufficiently documented.
- b. PROVIDER has neglected, failed, or refused to furnish information or to cooperate with the inspection, review, or audit of its program, work, or records.
- c. PROVIDER has failed to submit the invoice in a timely manner.

If LEA gives notice of intent to withhold, PROVIDER shall have fourteen (14) days from the date of receipt of said notice to correct such deficiency.

## 20. Modifications and Amendments:

This Contract may be modified or amended only by a written document signed by authorized representatives of PROVIDER and LEA. No change in this contract or in the ISSA shall result in a LEA financial obligation to PROVIDER in excess of the State/Federal reimbursement rate per student per year to the LEA.

#### 21. Subcontract and Assignment

PROVIDER shall not subcontract or assign any of the work contemplated under this Contract.

#### 22. Termination

a. This agreement may be terminated by LEA or PROVIDER at any time. PROVIDER's exercise of its right to terminate this contract shall not alleviate its responsibilities to complete any existing ISSA's. To terminate this Contract, either party shall give twenty (20) calendar days written notice as provided herein

- prior to the date of the termination. Upon termination without default of PROVIDER, LEA shall pay, without duplication, for all services satisfactorily performed to date of termination,
- b. In consideration of this payment, PROVIDER waives all rights to any further payment or damage. Upon termination, PROVIDER shall turn over to LEA all student records in its possession generated as a result of services rendered under this Contract, possessed by PROVIDER or under its control at the time of termination.
- c. An ISSA may be terminated at any time by the LEA or with the consent of the LEA, including, without limitations in the event that the LEA determines the PROVIDER is unable to meet the goals and timetables required under the ISSA with respect to the subject student. An Individual Supplemental Services Agreement may be terminated by PROVIDER only upon consent of the LEA. An ISSA shall terminate if the student ceases to be enrolled in the District. Upon termination under this paragraph, final payment from LEA will be calculated based upon a prorated calculation of total services actually rendered.

#### 23. Compliance with Laws

During the term of this agreement, PROVIDER shall comply with all applicable federal, State Board of Education, and local statutes, laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations relating to the provision of supplemental services, including securing and maintaining in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of services pursuant to this Agreement.

#### 24. Entire Agreement

This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between LEA and PROVIDER and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous understanding or agreement with respect to the services contemplated.

#### 25. Governing Law

The terms and conditions of this agreement shall be governed by the laws of the state of California with venue in Los Angeles County, California.

#### 26. Severability Clause

If any provision of this agreement is held in whole or in part to be unenforceable for any reason, the remainder of that provision and of the entire agreement shall be severable and remain in effect, to the extent that the intent of the parties can be fulfilled.

#### 27. Notices

#### REMUNERATION, REIMBURSEMENT, AND OTHER BENEFITS

#### Remuneration

Each member of the Governing Board may receive the maximum monthly compensation as provided for in law.

On an annual basis, the Board may increase the compensation of Board members beyond the limit delineated in Education Code 35120, in an amount not to exceed five percent (5%) based on the present monthly rate of compensation. Any increase made pursuant to this section shall be effective upon approval by the Board. (Education Code 35120)

Board members will not increase their compensation to exceed staff increase amount.

Board members are not required to accept payment for meetings attended.

If a member does not attend all Board meetings during the month, he/she is eligible to receive a percentage of the monthly compensation equal to the percentage of meetings attended unless otherwise authorized by the Board in accordance with law. (Education Code 35120)

A member may be paid for meetings he/she missed when the Board, by resolution, finds that he/she was performing designated services for the district at the time of the meeting or that he/she was absent because of illness, jury duty or a hardship deemed acceptable by the Board. (Education Code 35120)

#### **Reimbursement of Expenses**

Board members shall be reimbursed for traveling expenses incurred when authorized in advance by the Board. (Education Code 35044)

The rate of reimbursement shall be at the same rate specified for district personnel. (cf. 3350- Travel Expenses) (cf. 9240 - Board Development)

#### REMUNERATION, REIMBURSEMENT, AND OTHER BENEFITS (continued)

#### Health and Welfare Benefits

Board members may participate in the health and welfare benefits program provided for district employees.

The district shall pay the cost of all premiums required for Board members electing to participate in the district health and welfare benefits program. (Government Code 53205)

Health and welfare benefits for Board members shall be no greater than that received by district's non-safety employees with the most generous schedule of benefits. (Government Code 53208.5)

Health and welfare benefits provided to Board members may be extended at the same level to their spouses, dependent children under the age of 21, dependent children under the age of 25 who are full-time students at a college or university, and dependent children regardless of age who are physically or mentally incapacitated. (Government Code 53205.1)

#### **Benefits for Retired Board Members**

Any former member whose first term of office began on or after January 1, 1995, and any other member retiring from the Board after at least one term, may continue the health and welfare benefits program at their own expense if coverage is in effect at the time of retirement. (Government Code 53201)

#### Public Report

All remuneration, reimbursement and other benefits provided to individual Board members shall be considered public record to the extent allowed by law. The actual amount of remuneration, reimbursement and other benefits shall be disclosed on an annual basis in September a monthly basis for informational purposes.

#### 14.3b Budget Revisions to the General Fund

In accordance with Education Code 42127, all budget revisions to major object codes are to be approved by the governing board of the district.

The attached budget revisions reflect changes to the unrestricted and restricted portions of the General Fund. The total impact of these budget revisions on the Unrestricted General Fund is an increase of \$372,379 in revenues and a corresponding increase of the same amount in expenditures. The total impact on the Restricted General Fund is a decrease of \$386,383 in revenues and a decrease of \$387,583 in expenditures. Details of the attached budget revisions are as follows:

- General Ledger Journal ID Number #R1008 increases Unrestricted General Fund revenues and expenditures by \$49,770 respectively. This amount is derived from the CCEF Donation Empower Our Schools. The monies are being budgeted as revenues, have been allocated to each school site in accordance with the CCEF Empower Our Schools Campaign, and are also being budgeted as projected expenditures to be utilized by the school sites.
- General Ledger Journal ID Number #R1009 increases Unrestricted General Fund revenues and expenditures by \$18,293.03 respectively. These revisions result from the budgeting of donation account funds that have been carried-over from the previous year.
- General Ledger Journal ID Number #R1010 decreases Unrestricted General Fund revenues and expenditures by \$82,057. This decrease results from applying to the unit budgets the Revenue Limit Funding reduction that was imposed on CCUSD by the State Budget.
- General Ledger Journal ID Number #R1013 increases Unrestricted General Fund revenues by \$386,383. This increase results from transferring Restricted Instructional Materials Realignment Funding Program funds due to the flexibility allowed in the State Budget.
- General Ledger Journal ID Number #R1014 is the mirror image of #R1013 above. This revision decreases the Restricted General Fund by \$386,383. This decrease results from transferring Restricted Instructional Materials Realignment Funding Program funds to Unrestricted due to the flexibility allowed in the State Budget.

	ID Number #R1015 decreases the Restricted General Fund \$1,200. This decrease of ELAP expenditures is based upon exted entitlement.

#### 14.3e Food Service Payment and Collection Policy

The Food Service Department is a self-sustaining operation that manages and supports itself financially without relying on the general fund for assistance. The department provides more than one million meals annually to our students. With annual revenues of approximately \$2 million, the department receives payment for meals in a variety of forms including cash, personal check, Internet payments and federal and state subsidies. The attached document formalizes a Food Service Payment and Collection Policy that is designed to ameliorate any financial losses that result from non-payment of meals while concurrently serving our student population in a caring and responsible manner. Implementation of this policy would be effective February 1, 2010.

#### FOOD SERVICE PAYMENT AND COLLECTION POLICY

Payments to Food Service accounts will be accepted via:

- 1. A <u>personal check</u> and/or <u>cash</u> placed in a Food Service Department pre-printed envelope, then placed in the lock box at the school site's designated location.
- 2. An <u>electronic payment</u> using *e-funds*. An *e-funds* link is on the Culver City Unified School District web site and also on the web page of each individual school. *E-Funds* will accept two types of electronic transactions: debit or credit card payments. In order to establish an *e-funds* account, the parent/guardian must have a current District Student Identification Number.

All deposits placed in the lock box **no later than** 8:30 a.m. will be applied to the student's account on the same day after breakfast service. These deposited funds will be available in the student's account for lunch service of the same day. All deposits placed in the lock box after 8:30 a.m. will be available in the student's account on the following business day.

The following conditions apply to any and all personal checks that are returned unpaid (e.g., even for a "first time" returned check occurrence):

- A charge of \$10.00 will be applied to the account when a check is returned from the bank as unpaid.
- The student account will be flagged to not accept any additional payments in the form of a check.
- All future payments will only be accepted in the form of CASH or Money Order.

*E-funds* will charge \$15.00 directly to an account if payment is returned for nonsufficient funds. If an *e-funds* deposit is returned for any other reason (e.g., a closed account or an incorrect routing number) then Food Service will charge the student account \$10.00 and all future payments will <u>only</u> be accepted in the form of CASH or Money Order.

All students approved for free or reduced price meals will be fed. However, elementary students who come to the cafeteria without money or without funds in their account will be fed as follows:

- 1. Students will qualify for a free or reduced price meal if a current approved Free or Reduced Meal Application is on file in the Food Service office, or if the Food Service Department has issued a letter of *Direct Certification*.
- 2. Students who are new to the District will be fed a full meal for the first three (3) meals only. They will be charged the current full-paid price and these charges will be applied to their cafeteria account. Any and all charges applied to a student account prior to the approval date of a current Free or Reduced meal application will remain on the student account and the parent/guardian will be held responsible for full payment regardless of a change in Free or Reduced status.

#### FOOD SERVICE PAYMENT AND COLLECTION POLICY

- 3. Students will be allowed to charge only three (3) meals. The value of these meals will not exceed the cash equivalent of three (3) full price meals.
- 4. If a student comes through the serving line without money, Food Service personnel will issue a notice to the student, attention parent/guardian, via the teacher's mailbox. The teacher will then send the notice home to the parent with the student at the end of the day.
- 5. If a student comes through the service line, does not have money for a meal and has exceeded the three (3) meal credit limit, an alternate nutritionally adequate meal will be offered to the student. A nutritionally adequate meal will consist of a cheese sandwich and nonfat white milk. (An adequate substitution may be made by Food Service without prior notice.) A written notice will be placed in the teacher's mailbox to be sent home to the parent/guardian with the student at the end of the day.
- 6. The Food Service office will generate a Low Balance Report (\$10 or below) and a Negative Balance Report every Monday. Phone calls will be made on Monday evening notifying parent/guardian of a low and/or negative cafeteria balance. The call will state the current account balance. If a parent/guardian receives a phone call stating a negative account balance, they are to know that this will also serve as notification that their student is receiving an alternate meal.

#### In addition:

- 1. Cafeteria balances may be transferred between household members only.
- 2. Parents/guardians are solely responsible for ensuring that their student's cafeteria account is active and not in negative status.
- 3. No credit or partial meal service credit will be extended to any middle school or high school student. An alternate meal will not be provided, but they will be offered a piece of fresh fruit and nonfat white milk.
- 4. Refund requests will only be accepted from June 1 through June 30 for the current school year for accounts with a balance of \$10 or more. All requests must be submitted in writing to the Food Service department. Requests must include parent/guardian name, current address, student(s) name, school location, grade, District student identification number and Food Service PIN number. Please allow 6 to 10 weeks for refund request processing.

#### 14.3f Rejection of Claim
