Call to Order

Board President Dr. Beagles-Roos called the meeting of the Culver City Unified School District Board of Education to order at 6:00 p.m. The Board adjourned to Closed Session at 6:01 p.m. and reconvened the public meeting at 7:00 p.m. with all Board members in attendance. Middle school student Rachel Lewis led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Report from Closed Session

Dr. Beagles-Roos reported that the Governing Board met in Closed Session regarding issues listed on today's Closed Session agenda and announced that no reportable actions were taken.

8. Adoption of Agenda

It was moved by Mr. Zeidman and seconded by Mrs. Davis that the Board adopt the September 22, 2009 agenda as presented. The motion was unanimously approved.

9. Consent Agenda

Dr. Beagles-Roos called the Consent Agenda and asked if any member of the audience or the Board wished to withdraw any item. No items were withdrawn. It was moved by Mr. Gourley and seconded by Mr. Zeidman to approve Consent Agenda Items 9.1 through 9.4 as presented. Janet Chabola inquired if the Minutes were in fact for July 27, 2009 and not the previous meeting. Dr. Beagles-Roos confirmed that they were as stated. The motion was unanimously approved.

10. Awards, Recognitions and Presentations

10.1 Spotlight on Achievement – Districtwide Accountability

Ms. Laura provided an overview of student achievement throughout the District and explained the accountability system. Her presentation consisted of a Power Point Presentation showing the API and AYP scores districtwide, and she discussed how the District will move forward. Karlo Silbiger thanked Ms. Laura for presenting the information and shared additional information that he would be interested in hearing. Board members commended Ms. Laura on her presentation and expressed how proud they were of the students and staff. Mr. Gourley commented on how much time is wasted on the NCLB requirements. Further discussion ensued.

11. Public Recognition

11.1 Superintendent's Report

Dr. Coté reported on enrollment being monitored and the attempts being made to balance enrollment in the classes. She stated that she is proud that our schools did very well and the District is doing a fine job trying to close the achievement gap. Dr. Coté reported on her meeting with the Fineshreiber Foundation and expressed her gratitude for their financial support to the District. She informed the Board of her upcoming meetings.

11.2 Assistant Superintendents' Reports

Ms. Laura reported on an application being written for a new Enhancing Education Through Technology grant to promote proficiency in technology by the eighth grade, and provided details of what the funding would cover. She also reported on upcoming professional development opportunities, and the staff at El Rincon Elementary being trained on the "Being a Writer" Program.

Mr. El Fattal reported that the independent auditors were at the District last week to prepare for the 2008-2009 Independent Audit.

Mrs. Jaffe gave an update on CBEDS and how the procedure for teachers to provide the necessary information has been simplified. She complimented the IT Department, and commended Diane Lococo on how much time she spent inputting the information.

11.3 Members of the Audience

Members of the audience spoke about:

- Robert Zirgulis shared brainstorming ideas to bring in money for the District such as selling some of the
 District's property and having a buyback provision. He also stated he would like a Resolution against the
 City for wasting money frivolously on lawsuits; and commented he was in support of the Dog Therapy
 Program.
- Arielle Singer commented on the 8th grade math textbooks and felt there should be a separate copy provided to the students for home and school use.
- Anneliese Meyer commented on the 8th grade math textbooks and would also like a copy for home and a copy for school.
- Craig Singer commented on textbooks and stated that the 8th grade math textbook was the only one where an extra set was not given.
- Karlo Silbiger stated that he also went to the Middle School and when he attended he did not have a locker so he had to carry his books. He recalled in the 90s when the music program was cut due to budget issues, and he thanked the Board and staff for not cutting the programs. Mr. Silbiger extended an invitation to a performance by AVPA students at the High School.
- Rachel Lewis announced information for this year's Blood Drive on October 8th and extended an invitation for the community to show support.
- Kathy Paspalis confirmed the next Anti-Bullying Committee meeting date.

11.4 Student Representatives' Reports

Middle School Student Representative

The representative for the Culver City Middle School was not present.

Culver Park Student Representative

Jessica Romo, Culver Park High School Student Representative, was not present.

Culver City High School Student Representative/Student Board Member

Noya Kansky, Student Board Member, reported on activities at Culver City High School, including an update on the College Fair; the upcoming Homecoming game; an upcoming assembly showcasing the clubs on campus; the House of Representatives meeting and possibly assigning them additional duties; and the high school students earning service learning hours by helping the teachers.

11.5 Members of the Board

Board Members spoke about:

- Mrs. Davis commented on her attendance at the Back to School Night events and stated how she loved the continuity in what the schools were doing. She was happy to see what the students, teachers, and administration were achieving. Mrs. Davis was also glad to hear the presentation about the District's test scores, and stated she felt sorry for the issues the students were facing in regards to their textbooks. She stated she previously asked about charter districts and requested additional information. Dr. Coté responded that charters are being done across the country, but usually in large urban districts. She further explained a little about how the charter districts run the schools, and stated that there will be a full report at a later meeting. Mrs. Davis requested the information to see if it would help our district financially.
- Mr. Zeidman thanked the students and principals for coming to the meeting. He stated that he received a
 number of complaints about students sitting on stools in the classrooms because they were too crowded,
 and the cafeterias running out of food.
- Dr. Russell commented that if the complaints regarding the lack of food at the schools are valid, he would hope that it is not a surprise to administrators. He stated that he sympathizes with the students regarding the textbook issues that they spoke about.
- Mr. Gourley stated that he would like to hear more about the textbook situation, and the possibility of having the textbooks online. He thanked the students for coming to the meeting and providing public service by stating their issues regarding the textbooks, and making announcements such as the Blood Drive. He also inquired about a disagreement between the City and the District over who cleans and maintains the bathrooms at Helms Field after the games.
- Dr. Beagles-Roos thanked the students for coming to the meeting. In regards to the textbooks, she stated how hard it was to make the decisions on the budget cuts and she thinks she will need to go back and review the costs of the textbooks. She agreed that she would like to hear follow up information on the lack of food in the cafeteria. Dr. Beagles-Roos reported on her attendance at the Back to School Night events and stated that she enjoyed going to the two SIP classrooms at La Ballona. She spoke about CCEF and their upcoming fundraisers, and provided updates to the Board on DCAT's meeting and the Friends of the Culver City Youth Health Center.

Mr. El Fattal presented an annual report to the Board listing the cost to the District for all expenditures paid out on behalf of each Board Member during the 2008-2009 fiscal year. George Laase stated that the simplicity of the report is there, but there was still not a clear column showing Board reimbursements. Further discussion ensued. Board members expressed that they did not have a problem with showing reimbursements.

Mr. El Fattal presented the Board Bylaw to Board members. Audience members and Board members provided their opinions on possible revisions. Dr. Russell stated he felt there should be a budget for new Board members to attend the CSBA conference. The Bylaw will be brought back for another reading and approval.

10. Awards, Recognitions and Presentations

10.1 American Citizenship Awards

Dr. Coté and the Assistant Superintendents read the names and accomplishments of each school's recipients of the American Citizenship Award for the month of October. The recipients were Jess Cadena from El Marino School; Isabel Parra from El Rincon Elementary; Kyle Nomura from La Ballona School; Paul Morales from Linwood E. Howe School; Alexander Marotti from Farragut School; Ahmad Osman from Culver City Middle School; Anthony Sandoval from Culver Park High School; and Arnaldo "Ivan" Aquino from Culver City High School. Board members presented each recipient with a pin and certificate; and thanked the students and their families for attending the meeting.

10.2 Spotlight on Student Achievement – El Marino Language School

Tracy Pumilia, Principal of El Marino Language School, presented the school's student achievement results as measured in both state and federal accountability systems. Mrs. Pumilia responded to questions from Board members and the audience.

11. Public Recognition

11.1 Superintendent's Report

Dr. Coté reported on her first parent and employee forums, and stated that all of the Back to School Nights had been completed. She expressed her gratitude to Westfield Shopping Center for their donation to the District. Dr. Coté announced the upcoming flu vaccination clinics that the District will be hosting and provided the dates, times and locations. She extended commendations to the school nurses who worked very hard to make the vaccinations available. Dr. Coté announced to the Board her upcoming schedule of activities.

11.2 Assistant Superintendents' Reports

Ms. Laura thanked Mrs. Pumilia for her presentation. She reported on the newly adopted math curriculum; the professional development opportunities; and the new teachers Open Court training. Ms. Laura provided an update on the Anti-Bullying Committee and stated that students will be receiving a questionnaire to provide their perception on bullying. She also announced that there will be a pre-school parent participation day for students and their parents with special needs.

Mr. El Fattal reported on the District participating in the upcoming California Shake Out on Thursday at 9:00 a.m. He announced that enrollment has increased, and that the Governor is anticipated to be signing off on new legislation soon.

Mrs. Jaffe reported on the Westfield Shopping Center Grand Opening event, and how well the high school band and cheerleaders performed. She stated that Mr. Pearson from the Middle School and Mrs. Magee from the High School received five thousand dollars each as a donation from Westfield. Mrs. Jaffe was happy to report that the District now has twelve newly tenured teachers.

11.3 Members of the Audience

Members of the audience spoke about:

- Robert Zirgulis inquired about what the District was going to do about the natatorium. He stated that he has made a proposal to sell it to investors and the proceeds could be used to help the budget deficit. He asked the Board to open up the natatorium and give investors the opportunity to give proposals. Mr. Zirgulis also stated that he thought the therapy dogs were a great idea and would like to see the program in all of the schools.
- A letter from Martin Feinberg regarding a proposal for the natatorium was submitted for inclusion with the Minutes.
- Dee Seehusen commented on the advantages of having ROTC at the high school, and expressed that ROTC is not a preparation for the military.
- Students of AVPA gave a presentation on this year's student art exhibition.
- Kristine Hatanaka provided information on a national program called Art21 Educators of which she was one of the fifteen teachers chosen to participate.

- Nadia Hamud expressed her concern that the District does not acknowledge Islamic holidays.
- Gary Haddick from Remax Alliance Group commented on sale leasebacks in regards to a possible idea for the natatorium.
- Robert Gray stated it would make no sense for the Board to sell the natatorium. He stated he attended
 Back to School Night and some teachers mentioned that classes were larger and he was under the
 impression that the Board agreed not to increase class sizes. Mr. Zeidman stated that the Board decided
 that class sizes would not increase at the Middle School and High School, and asked for additional
 information on this topic. Dr. Beagles-Roos and Dr. Russell agreed that they would like follow-up
 information.

Dr. Beagles-Roos welcomed Evan Wilson as the new Middle School Student Representative.

11.4 Student Representatives' Reports

Middle School Student Representative

Evan Wilson, Culver City Middle School Student Representative, reported on activities at Culver City Middle School, including students brainstorming for new Halloween activities; the magazine drive; and the upcoming Pennies for Patients Drive.

Jessica Romo, Culver Park High School Student Representative, reported on activities at Culver Park High School, including students seeing a play called "Eclipse;" the school getting two new counseling groups; and an update on the new HeArt Project for this year with a theme called Backyard/Front Porches.

Culver City High School Student Representative/Student Board Member

Noya Kansky, Student Board Member, reported on activities at Culver City High School, including the success of Back to School Night; an update on the first House of Representatives meeting and the Representatives' new duties; the first Blood Drive of the year; an update on the first Club Fair; the ASB Fundraiser being this week; the sophomore Vice President election; Homecoming activities; and Club Luau on October 30th.

11.5 Members of the Board

Board Members spoke about:

- Dr. Russell reported on his attendance at Back to School Night events and stated that everyone appeared
 to be very enthusiastic. He also gave commendations to Kristine Hatanaka for the great work that she is
 doing.
- Mr. Zeidman reported on his attendance at the Westfield and Best Buy events. He also attended Back to School Night events and stated that they were all great. Mr. Zeidman expressed his appreciation to the students and parents for all of their fundraising efforts. 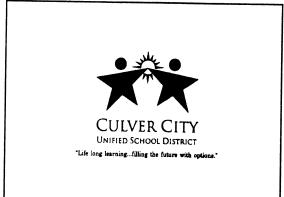

12.1 Comprehensive Energy Analysis Update

At the September 8, 2009 Board Meeting, the Board of Education was presented with an initial overview of a potential Energy Conservation and Facilities Modernization project that included the following components:

- implementing various energy conservation technologies at all sites;
- installing solar panels at key locations throughout the District;
- re-architecting the Natatorium building into a multi-purpose building or swimming pool;
- installing synthetic turf at Helms Field and modernizing much of the athletics facilities infrastructure; and
- upgrading Robert Frost Auditorium.

The September 8 initial overview concluded that a comprehensive energy solutions project is fiscally viable and should be considered for further study and possible implementation. The preliminary viability conclusions were based on multiple site visits, meetings and significant analyses that were conducted by Chevron Energy Solutions and District personnel.

Today, David El Fattal, Assistant Superintendent of Business Services, and Suzanne Gentilini, Business Development Manager Public Sector of Chevron Energy Solutions, will further discuss project options through renderings and photographs of actual installations; recent legislation surrounding renewable energy; potential rebates and incentives applicable to the project including California Solar Initiative incentives; financing options; and, next steps which focus on implementation of a Comprehensive Energy Analysis (CEA).

14.3a Budget Revisions to the General Fund

In accordance with Education Code 42127, all budget revisions to major object codes are to be approved by the governing board of the district.

The attached budget revisions reflect changes to the unrestricted and restricted portions of the General Fund. The total impact of these budget revisions on the Unrestricted General Fund is an increase of \$317,444 in revenues and a decrease of \$13,160 in expenditures. The total impact on the Restricted General Fund is an increase of \$51,180. Details of the attached budget revisions are as follows:

- <u>General Ledger Journal ID Number #R1016</u> increases Restricted General Fund revenues \$69,477 as a result of an increase in pupil transportation funding.
- General Ledger Journal ID Number #R1017 decreases Unrestricted General Fund IMRFP revenues by \$21,455 and increases books and supplies expenditures \$70,000.
- <u>General Ledger Journal ID Number #R1018</u> decreases Unrestricted General Fund SIP expenditures by \$56,840 due to reductions imposed by the State Budget.
- <u>General Ledger Journal ID Number #R1019</u> increases Unrestricted General Fund revenues \$338,899 due to an ADA projected increase of 63.
- <u>General Ledger Journal ID Number #R1020</u> decreases Restricted General Fund revenues by \$18,297 based on a reduction in revenue limit special education funding.

14.3b Comprehensive Energy Analysis

Chevron Energy Solutions has recently completed a Feasibility Energy Assessment (FEA) for the District. This high-level analysis was conducted at no charge in order to help determine [for the District and Chevron] the fiscal viability of implementing an Energy Conservation and Facilities Modernization Project at CCUSD. The FEA identified potential sustainability measures, conducted a utility analysis, provided an estimated range of costs and savings, and identified/calculated preliminary rebates and incentives. The results of the FEA study were presented to the Board of Education at the September 8, 2009 Board Meeting.

The next step of the Energy Conservation and Facilities Modernization Project is for Chevron Energy Solutions to complete a Comprehensive Energy Analysis (CEA). This detailed engineering study, which takes 60 - 120 days, requires additional in-depth analyses which expand upon the already completed FEA. The CEA includes the following components:

- Complete an energy solutions project scope in collaboration with District staff;
- Complete additional project scope for modernization of selected facilities (e.g., Natatorium building as swimming pool and/or multi-purpose facility; Robert Frost Auditorium; Athletic facilities and infrastructure);
- Conduct detailed engineering studies on the agreed-upon projects;
- Confirm site selection for Photovoltaic (if applicable);
- Conduct competitive procurement process;
- Provide firm costs and savings on each scope of work;
- Develop firm fixed pricing schedule (Chevron Energy Solutions has a firm "no change order" policy);
- Confirm, apply for and reserve rebates and incentives;
- Finalize financial models and develop financial modeling alternatives;
- Secure project funding;
- Confirm performance guarantee (if applicable); and
- Contract negotiation and contract preparation for Board of Education approval.

The CEA is conducted at no charge by Chevron; however, a CEA cancellation fee of \$65,000 will be billed to the District only if Chevron Energy Solutions substantiates the agreed upon objectives and projections contained in the FEA and the District elects not to move forward with the project. In other words, Chevron has already established through its preliminary FEA study that a viable energy solutions project exists. If the more indepth CEA study substantiates this fact and the District decides not to proceed, then the cancellation fee would apply. The District may also be responsible to pay any additional

The Culver City Unified School District and the Culver City Federation of Teachers have completed negotiations for the 2008-2009 school year and agree to maintain the provisions of the current certificated collective bargaining agreement, except as indicated below:

ARTICLE 25: HOURS OF WORK

Section E

- 1. All employees will be expected to perform duties which may or may not occur within the minimum hours specified in Section A of this Article. Such duties include, but are not limited to planning and selecting and preparing materials for instruction; participating in curriculum development; receiving and evaluating work of pupils; conferring and counseling with pupils, parents, staff, and administrators; providing and supervising necessary weekly make-up periods; keeping records; supervising and providing leadership of pupil organizations; participating in and attending parent, community, Back -to-School Night and Open House activities; supervising teacher aides as assigned; attending staff, departmental, and grade level meetings; participating in approved staff development programs; and service on committees providing advice and service to the District.
 - a. Extra duty assignments shall be identified by the site administrator at each school site in consultation with the school leadership team and offered to unit members on a voluntary basis.

ARTICLE 27: ELEMENTARY PREPARATION TIME

Section E: A task force will be formed by September 30, 2009 that includes representatives from administration, elementary PE teachers, K-5 upper and lower grade teachers from CCFT to review bell schedules to determine if 180 minutes per week for elementary preparation time is feasible. Recommendations of the task force shall be provided to the District and CCFT for review and consideration as soon as possible as determined by the task force.

ARTICLE 17: EXTENDED PERSONAL LEAVE

Section F -- Family Care and Medical Leave

1. Eligibility

Pursuant to the federal Family Medical Leave Act of 1993 [29 U.S.C. §2601, et seq.] (FMLA) and California Family Rights Act [Government Code Section 12945.2](CFRA), and in Board Administrative Regulation 4161.8/4261.8/4361.8, any employee who has been employed by the District for at least twelve (12) months and has actually worked at least 1,250 hours during the twelve (12) months immediately prior to commencing the leave shall be eligible to take up to twelve (12) workweeks of unpaid family care and medical leave in a twelve (12) month period, counting backward from the first date such leave is taken. Full-time teachers shall be presumed to work 1, 250 hours unless proven otherwise by the District. If the leave is to care for an injured, covered military service member, eligible unit members shall be entitled to twenty-six (26) workweeks of leave for each illness or injury, within twelve (12) months of the first date of leave for this reason.

2. Qualifying Reasons

Family leave shall be available for any of the following reasons:

- A. Birth of a child and to care for the newborn, adopted or foster child within twelve (12) months after the birth or placement for adoption or foster care;
- B. To care for a parent, spouse, child or Registered Domestic Partner (CFRA leave only) with a serious health condition;
- C. Because of the employee's own serious health condition that makes the employee unable to perform the functions of his or her own position;
- D. Because of any qualifying exigency arising out of the fact that an employee's parent, spouse, or child is a covered military member on active duty (or has been notified of an impending call or order to active duty) in support of a contingency operation (FMLA leave only); or
- E. Because of a serious injury or illness incurred in the line of duty on active duty in the Armed Forces in support of a contingency operation affecting an employee's spouse, child, parent, or next of kin, who is a service member of the Armed Forces, including the National Guard and Reserves, for whom the employee is needed to provide care (FMLA leave only). An employee taking leave under this section shall be entitled to twenty-six (26) workweeks of leave in a twelve (12) month period commencing on the first day leave is taken to care for the service member.

Definitions

A. Child:

For leave taken for by an employee for the birth of his/her child, or placement of a child with the employee for adoption or foster care, or to care for his/her child with a serious health condition, "child" means the employee's biological, adopted or foster child, a stepchild, a legal ward, or a child of a person standing *in loco parentis* who is either under 18 years of age or an adult dependent child eighteen (18) or older and incapable of self-care because of mental or physical disability [29 U.S.C. §2611 (12)].

For leave taken to care for a service member with a serious health condition or because of a military member's call to active duty, the employee's child for whom he or she is taking leave need not be under eighteen (18) years of age, but must meet all of the other requirements specified above [29 C.F.R §825.122(g), (h), and (i)].

B. Military member and Service Member:

"Military member" and "service member" shall be as defined in the FMLA and its regulations [29 C.F.R §825.800].

C. Next of Kin:

For purposes of leave taken to care for a covered service member injured during active duty, "next of kin" means the nearest blood relative of the covered service member who is not the service member's parent, spouse, or child, as specified in the FMLA. If the service member has designated a "next of kin," only that individual may take family and medical leave to care for him or her. If the service member has not designated a "next of kin," the "next of kin:" for purposes of FMLA leave to care for the service member shall be in the following order of priority: Blood relatives who have been granted legal custody of the covered service member by court decree or statutory provision, siblings, grandparents, aunts and uncles, and first cousins [29 C.F.R §825.122(d)].

D. Parent:

"Parent" means a biological, foster, or adoptive parent, a stepparent, a legal guardian, or other person who stood *in loco parentis* to the employee when the employee was a child [29 U.S.C. §2611 (7)].

E. Qualifying Exigency:

A "qualifying exigency" related to a family member who is a covered military member shall be as defined in the FMLA regulations.

F. Registered Domestic Partner

"Registered domestic partner" shall be those persons registered with the California Secretary of State pursuant to the provisions of California Family Code Section 297.

G. Serious Health Condition:

"Serious health condition" shall be as defined in the FMLA and CFRA statutes and regulations that require that the employee or family member be unable to work.

4. Employee Notice Requirements

An employee must provide at least thirty (30) days advance notice before leave is to begin if the need for the leave is foreseeable based on an expected birth, placement for adoption or foster care, planned medical treatment for a serious health condition of the employee or of a family member, or the planned medical treatment for a serious injury or illness of a covered service member. In all cases, however, the determination of when an employee could practicably provide notice must take into account the individual facts and circumstances.

On or before the first day of an employee's family and medical leave, the employee shall notify the District of his/her anticipated date of return to work. The District may require periodic updates on the employee's intent to return to work. If because of changed circumstances an employee requires more or less leave than originally anticipated, the employee shall give the District at least two business days' notice of his or her intent to return to work.

5. Health Benefits

The District will maintain coverage under the group health care plan for the duration of the family and medical leave, at the same level and under the same conditions as such coverage would have been provided had the employee not taken the leave. While on family and medical leave, employees remain responsible for and must continue to pay any share of the health premiums they now pay for which they would be responsible if they were working.

6. Use of Paid Leave

During a family and medical leave, the employee must concurrently use any available sick leave, extended illness leave, vacation leave, or other accrued time off, or any other available paid leave. Such paid leave may only be used for reasons specified and under the terms and conditions of the collective bargaining agreement, Board Policy and/or Administrative Regulation, unless otherwise agreed to by the District and the employee.

7. Reinstatement

Reinstatement procedures shall be as set forth in Board Administrative Regulation 4161.8/4261.8/4361.8 as adopted by the Board of Education, Culver City Unified School District.
